A. PURPOSE

The purpose of the policy is to establish and guide the framework for emergency management (EM) programs at all Old Dominion Universtate illies.

B. AUTHORITY

<u>Code of Virginia Sectio 231-1301, as mended</u> grants authority to the Board of Visitors to make rules and policies concerniting institution. Section $\mathcal{D}1(a)(6)$ of the Board of Visitors <u>Bylaws</u> grants authority to the President to implement the policies and procedures of the Board relating to University operations.

<u>Emergency Notification System (ENS)</u>Colloquially known as ODU Kerts, the University's combined protocols, training, systems, and equipped to provide emergency algorated notifications to the University community.

<u>Emergency Operations Center (E</u>OC) he physical virtual location at which the coolidation of information and resources to support or scene inciden/temergency/event management activities takes place.

Essential Designated Personnel Exempt and nonexempt employees who are required to work during an authorized closing because their piosis have been designatedly the hiring supervisor as essential to University operate during emergencies.
